This was followed by the Zapin Lenggang Kipas, that originated from Indonesian areas with a strong Islamic influence.

Next in the list was a slower dance with gentle tip-toe movements executed exclusively by girls, playing a traditional Indonesian instrument much like the Indian *ektara*. Here dancing and playing the instrument simultaneously made it enjoyable.

Besides there were Indonesian landscapes playing on a screen in the background and with their hands swaying and calculated hip movements as it were to transport the audience to the avenues of Indonesia. The lead singer,

singing the Bollywood's *Humko Humi Se Churalo*, added to the amusement which won the hearts of the audience.

The finale of the evening was a dance-drama of *Shikandi Weerapati*, adapted from *Mahabharata*.. However, here Shikandi is the icon of heroines, the fighting symbol of women's emancipation. Some lovely and elaborate traditional attire and headgear worn by the dancers, as they displayed bravery in the battlefield of Kurukshetra

Supreme Court, who gave away the awards, rued that the Fourth Estate, lifeline of democracy, has of late become polluted.

Recalling former US
President Abraham Lincoln's
words that the media was the
fourth pillar of the Constitution,
Justice Venkatachaliah
regretted that of late, the media
had forsaken its ideals and
moral values. "It is alarming
that the Freedom of the Press

has turned into Power of the Press," lamented Justice Venkatachaliah and berated the media organisations that have discarded moral and ethical values by bowing to political and money power, leading to maladministration and near-anarchy.

Citing examples from history, Justice Venkatachaliah said, "Indian administration is worse than the situation that prevailed in France before the French Revolution, in China before the Communist rule and the Russian Revolution of 1917."

He recalled how politicians' honesty during the early years of post-freedom India, when the daughter of a Chief Minister could not appear for her exam in time as the Chief Minister had refused to provide his State car for her personal use.

He lauded BVB for identifying achievers in various
